
2011 Annual Meeting

2011 Recycling Extravaganza Again A Success

The Village held its third annual Recycling Extravaganza on Saturday, September 24, 2011. Because of volunteer effort by residents, this event has very little cost to the Village, but has tremendous benefit to our environment.

It was another very busy event! This year residents kept tons of recyclable material out of landfills:

- 202 Lead-acid Batteries
- * 120 Bikes
- 117,520 lbs of electronics (exceeds last year's 109,655 pounds)
- 115 American flags
- * 126 propane tanks
- 20,000 lbs of Shredded Paper
- Plus scrap metal and other misc. items



The many persons who volunteered their time included PDHA members, several of whom volunteer each year. This year the Village ran out of time so it wasn't able to assist all residents who made the effort to properly recycle their items at this event. Due to the continuing success of the annual event, the Village has now decided to sponsor electronics recycling at the fenced-in area behind the Village Hall on the first Saturday of each month from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. – By Mark Thoman

1846 Blodgett House Update

Our community has come a long way in its efforts to save and restore a significant part

of Downers Grove's heritage – the 1846 Blodgett House. The Blodgett Family's second home in our community is one of the oldest houses in the Village and played an active role in the Underground Railroad. During the last four years, the all volunteer Downers Grove Heritage Preservation Corporation has moved this house onto the grounds of the Downers Grove Park District and restored the exterior to its 19th Century appearance, as shown here.

This work has been accomplished almost exclusively with private, individual and corporate donations and support – most notably from the Sara Lee Corporation, the Foundation of One Smooth Stone, Grant Dicke and the Downers Grove Park District.

The Heritage Preservation Corporation acquired the 1846 Blodgett House in 2007 and moved it into Wandschneider Park near its original location on Maple Avenue. A license agreement with the Downers Grove Park District permits the group to restore and renovate the House with the understanding that, after renovations have been completed and appropriate historic exhibits have been installed, the House will be donated to the Park District to operate as a museum of early Downers Grove history with emphasis on the community's Underground Railroad activities. We are cooperating with the Park District to add descriptive signage around the exterior of the Blodgett House to help people learn about the heritage of this significant project.

We are also working to reinforce the floors and restore the interior in preparation for exhibits and public tours. As we work to make the interior of the Blodgett House accessible to visitors, we are developing specific building plans to guide our interior renovation work. Currently, we are thinking that the interior of the house should be "finished" in a manner that will permit visitors to appreciate unique construction features of this mid-19th Century home, as well as the Blodgett Family's involvement with the Underground Railroad. Here are three conceptual sketches of possible interior design arrangements that display structural features such as mortise and tenon installation of wall studs on the first floor and hand-hewn first floor joists as seen from the basement.

Residents & Businesses Help Plan Village Future

In 2009 the Village Staff undertook the task of Total Community Development 3 (TCD3), the third time on our Village history that such a large task was undertaken. TCD1 directly resulted in Good Samaritan Hospital being built in Downers Grove. TCD2 resolved to provide for pedestrian safety with a policy of Village-wide sidewalks on at least one side of every street. For TCD3, well over a thousand residents and dozens of businesses participated, along with most governing bodies and several civic groups, including Pierce Downer's Heritage Alliance.

In meetings, focus groups, and on-line exercises the whole of the Village came together to provide a voice for our community's future. The data gathered in the year long effort of TCD3 served two purposes:

- ▲ It identified the need for a better way to address the entire range community issues more responsively to the community as a whole, and in its different parts.
- ▲ It laid the foundation for the Village's first updated Comprehensive Plan in over 46 years.

From January 2010 through March 2011 the Comprehensive Plan Ad Hoc Committee, made up of 11 residents (including PDHA's own Chair pro tem Mark Thoman), worked with staff and consultants to incorporate much of the TCD3 information into a new Planning Document for the Village.

Pierce Downer's Heritage Alliance participated diligently in both the TCD3 process, and in the Comprehensive Plan process. Our participation ensured that our heritage and environment are represented, acknowledged, and protected now and in the future. We are also recommending that the Village revisit its Comprehensive Plan within five years, to keep this "living document" up to date and relevant. The Village Council accepted and adopted the Comprehensive Plan on October 4, 2011, culminating over two and a half years of diligent work. Plug In to Greener Power

Illinois consumers can choose an electricity supplier, just as they can choose a supplier for natural gas or phone service. The Illinois Commerce Commission oversees the choice program and has a website explaining the program and options available.



The website lists 40 different plans by 15 different companies. Of these, 17 of the plans by 8 different companies have a green aspect. The green plans guarantee that some or all of the electricity supplied will come from renewable resources. Some of the plan descriptions say they combine green energy with rates lower than most consumers currently pay.

Customers who switch to a Retail Electric Supplier still deal with their regular electric utility (ComEd for most of us) for billing and outages. What changes is who supplies the electricity that you consume. For further information, visit www.pluginIllinois.org.
